Investigate what happened with his first marriage and divorce

Investigate his military time in the US and taking command, or training up, a US army unit

Investigate his military time in India and birth of 1912 Denis John Carleton in Bareilly / India, then returning to Cork, Ireland with his army unit

When viewing the information below, it is important to note the timeline. For example, on the first one, (**1915 - By 21 May 1915, he was a 2nd Lieutenant**) we can see he had been In Ranks for 14 years, 294 days. This makes him in ranks by 31 July 1900. To make ranks could take anywhere between 1 to 3 years. This would mean he joins between 1897 and 1899

The Prince of Wales's Leinster Regiment (Royal Canadians) was an infantry regiment of the British Army from 1881 to 1922. It recruited mainly from five Irish counties and was disbanded following the creation of the Irish Free State. [1, 2, 3]

The regiment operated a mix of Regular, Service, and Reserve battalions: [1, 2, 3]

- **1st Battalion:** Served on the Western Front, in Macedonia, Egypt, Palestine, and India.
- **2nd Battalion:** Served on the Western Front and in the British Army of the Rhine and Silesia.

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- **Service Battalions (6th & 7th):** Raised for World War I, seeing action at Gallipoli, Salonika, and the Western Front.
 - **Reserve Battalions (3rd, 4th & 5th):** Remained at home to train and send reinforcements. [[1](#), [2](#), [3](#)]

2nd Battalion

August 1914 : stationed at Cork. Part of 17th Brigade in 6th Division.

Moved to Cambridge on 18 August then on to Newmarket.

12 September 1914 : landed at St Nazaire in France.

14 October 1915 : transferred with brigade to 24th Division.

19 October 1915 : transferred to 73rd Brigade in same Division.

1 February 1918 : moved to Tincourt and transferred to 47th Brigade in 16th (Irish) Division. Absorbed troops from disbanded 7th Bn.

13 April 1918 : absorbed troops from disbanded 6th Connaught Rangers.

23 April 1918 : transferred to 88th Brigade in 29th Division.

23 June 1919: battalion arrives in England and goes into barracks at Portsmouth.

4 November 1919: moves to Sobraon Barracks, Colchester. It subsequently served with the Army of Occupation in Upper Silesia.

- **1899–1902 (South Africa):** The regiment served in the Boer War. The 2nd Battalion had previously been stationed across locations like Preston and Dublin, and their deployment solidified the battle honour "South Africa, 1900-02". [1, 2, 3]
- **1914 (Outbreak of World War I):** At the start of the conflict, the 2nd Battalion was stationed in Cork, Ireland, as part of the 17th Brigade, 6th Division. They quickly returned to England and were deployed to the Western Front in France and Belgium. [1, 2, 3]
- **1914–1918 (Western Front):** Throughout the Great War, the battalion suffered heavy casualties and participated in numerous harrowing engagements, including the Ypres sector and the Third Battle of Ypres (Menin Gate). [1, 2, 3, 4]
- **1919–1921 (Rhine Occupation):** Following the armistice, the 2nd Battalion briefly returned to barracks in Colchester before undertaking post-war occupation duties in Germany. [1, 2, 3, 4]
- **1921–1922 (Upper Silesia):** From June 1921 to March 1922, the 2nd Battalion was detached to the German town of Oppeln (modern-day Opole, Poland). They were sent to police tensions and maintain order between German and Polish communities during the post-plebiscite territorial vote. [1, 2, 3]
- **1922 (Disbandment):** With the establishment of the Irish Free State, British regiments that traditionally recruited from the southern Irish counties—including all five battalions of the Leinsters—were disbanded. The 2nd Battalion's colours were officially deposited at Windsor Castle in June 1922

1887 – 1899. He joins the army under John Michael Carleton. We can see by the evidence below that on 21 May 1915, he had been serving as a 2nd Lieutenant for 14 years & 294 days and was a warrant officer class 2 for 113 days. This takes his joining date to be before July 1900 and to make ranks would take between 1 to 3 years

1904 - By Jun 1904, he was a corporal (acting Sargent) - 1 Leinster Regiment, Devonport, Devon. He can be seen on court martial records as “Drunkenness on duty”

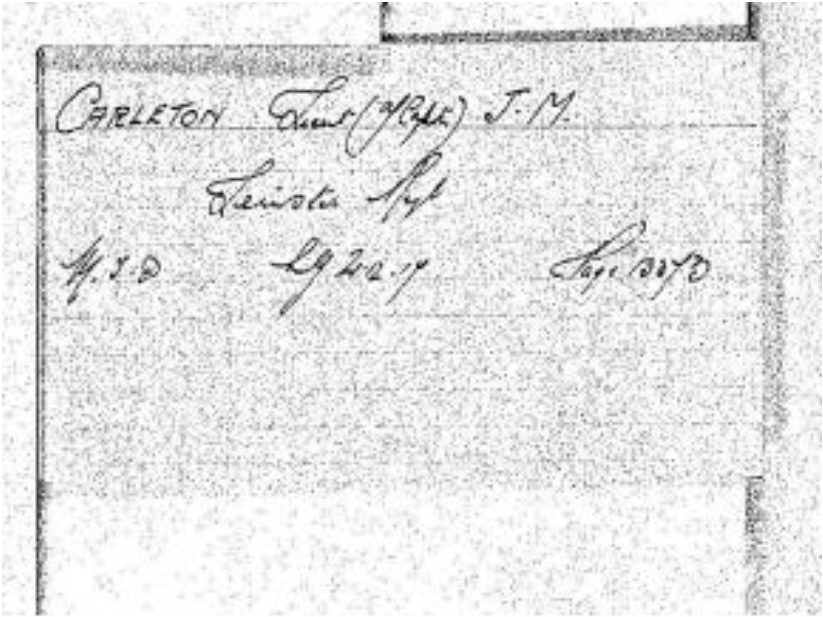

SIDECAR FATALITY
Woman's Death At Devonport Road Junction

The overturning of a motor cycle on the pavement at the junction of Haddington-road and Benbow-street, Devonport, pinning the woman occupant of the sidecar underneath it and causing fatal injuries, was revealed at the inquest on Margaret May Lock, 45, wife of John Charles Lock, skilled labourer, H.M. Dockyard, of 18, Charlotte-row, Devonport.

The husband said his wife had been in the sidecar with his step-son on many occasions.

William George Webb, retired joiner, H.M. Dockyard, 69, Pasley-street, Stoke, who was walking with his wife, said as they approached the road junction he saw a motor-car, and heard a motor cycle, which appeared to be travelling "fairly fast."

The driver of the car apparently heard the cycle before he saw it and brought his car nearly to a standstill. The cyclist's machine must have skidded.

The Coroner: Was there any need for the cyclist to have crossed the road?—I think he got into a skid and lost control.

Mrs. Sarah Webb, wife of the previous witness, said she did not think the cyclist realized that the car had stopped.

MATTER OF SPEED.

Dennis John Carleton, dispenser, aged 23, of 18, Charlotte-row, whose left arm was in a sling, the motor cyclist concerned, said he was the son of Mrs. Lock. When approaching Benbow-street

he thought his speed was 25 miles per hour. It was about 15 yards from the junction that he first saw the bonnet of the car. He did not think he would be able to pull up in time to avoid a collision, so he applied his brakes and tried to turn right into Benbow-street. "I do not remember very much else," he added.

"I may have instinctively tried to turn to the left again to go up Haddington-road."

The Coroner: Do you think 25 miles per hour was really slow enough to approach the junction of Benbow-street and Haddington-road?—Yes, because it is a first-class road.

The Coroner: Yet people in cars come out of side-roads just the same.

Mr. Carleton said that there was a chance of turning into Benbow-street, and he took that chance, but could not get round. His idea was to try to skid the combination round quickly and then correct the skid.

MOTORIST'S EVIDENCE.

Norman William George Pike, shipwright, R.N., H.M.S. Royal Sovereign, 18, Sussex-road, Ford, said he was driving a motor-car along Benbow-street, and as he approached the corner his speed was about ten miles per hour, and he sounded his horn.

Witness heard in reply another horn, and saw a motor cycle combination, which was "going at a fast speed." He pulled up, and his car was hardly in the main road.

"There was no need for the motor cyclist to have swerved," said Mr. Pike. "I think that at first he was afraid I was going on, and then seeing, after he had swerved to the right, that I had stopped, he changed his mind to go on his original course."

John Dobson, chauffeur, of 13, Colley End-road, Paignton, passenger in Mr. Pike's car, corroborated.

Con. Daniel Crutchley said the bonnet

Con. Daniel Crutchley said the bonnet of the car was protruding 5ft. 11in. into Haddington-road, leaving the cyclist 17ft. of clear road.

Mr. A. B. Christie, assistant house-surgeon, Prince of Wales's Hospital, Devonport, said Mrs. Lock must have had a pretty severe blow. The cause of death was compression of the brain, due to injuries received.

Summing up, Mr. Major said he should have thought 25 miles per hour was fast enough to approach that crossing, because of having vehicles and pedestrians there.

The jury, who sat for this case, returned a verdict of "Accidental death," and exonerated both drivers from blame.
